# Submission on Behalf of Kilcormac Community Planning Group

In Response to the Draft Territorial Just Transition Plan for Ireland

**Introduction:** Kilcormac Community Planning Group is a grouping of organisations from Kilcormac County Offaly. Involving Kilcormac Development Association (KDA), Kilcormac Killoughey GAA, Kilcormac Childcare Service, the Trench Trust and Green Offaly the focus of our work is to develop a strategic plan for the town. The plan will be a sustainable place based response to the significant change we face as a community, as we reimagine the future of our town as a place to live, work, be and visit.

**Kilcormac Community Planning Group,** welcomes Irelands Draft Territorial Just Transition Plan for the Midlands Region and makes the following Submission.

## 1. Territories Most Affected

We note that the research findings of the EnvEcon Report (Report on Challenges, needs and recommended actions for the most affected territories) that identifies County Offaly as one of the most affected by the transition. Kilcormac Community Planning Group, believe that County Offaly and particular communities within the county has been significantly more impacted than other counties in the territory. We contend that funding & associated supports under the EU Just Transition Fund should be weighted on the basis of those areas within the defined territory most negatively impacted by transition.

## 2. Development Need & Actions

Kilcormac Community Planning Group, acknowledges the breath of actions identified within the draft plan to support and stimulate economic growth and competitiveness, however we suggest that the scope of these actions should be extended to include supports that have a direct relevance to the community needs. We suggest that the scope of actions be extended to include supports for the development of tourism, creative industries, arts and culture & heritage, micro generation of renewable energy, biodiversity, micro enterprise and social infrastructure.

We contend that amending the draft plan to include these areas will further enhance the commitment to supporting a fair and equitable transition (NESC 2020).

## 3. Stakeholders in the Delivery and Implementation of Transition

Kilcormac Community Planning Group suggest that due consideration be given to recognising communities as a key stakeholder in the process of "taking a place based approach to" the transition to a green future. We know that our community has a range of assets (economic, social, cultural, environmental) at its disposal, that if supported in the right way can be harnessed to create jobs and add to the sustainability of our community. We suggest that local development/ social inclusion supports be used to resources community led innovation.

We express our thanks to the EU Commission, the Department of Environment, Climate Action and Communication and the Eastern & Midlands Regional Assembly for opportunity to respond to this public consultation on the Draft Territorial Plan for Ireland.
