What role should waste collectors play in the operation of a DRS? Unless the waste collectors are on a city council payroll they should have nothing to do with collecting. It shouldn't be a competitive thing, it should be a necessity that should be done as efficiently as possible.. to emphasise, i have seen several different dump trucks from several different companies doing the rounds of the same street collecting their own bins in the same week. That doesn't make sense so don't do it again.
