• The Report recommends a centralised, operational model for Ireland. Do you agree with this recommendation?

I lived in Leipzig where they had a similar model in shops. The bottles/tins returned would give a receipt to use at the till to pay for groceries.

• What role should waste collectors play in the operation of a DRS?

I believe the containers should be accessible to all. Not placed out in industrial estates. Remove the need for a car to get to these places.

• The DRS study proposes a deposit per container of €0.20. Do you think this is appropriate? If not should it be higher or lower or should different deposit rates apply depending on container size?

Deposits depend on container size and material e.g. plastic / aluminium. There needs to be an incentive for people to recycle more. So having 20c more for a larger bottle or tin can would work.

• Consumers need to know about a DRS long before it becomes operational – do you have any suggestions as to how best the introduction of a DRS can be communicated to the public?

Online, newspapers - signs in shops or places where the containers will be placed. Info packs to schools and unis. Not posting out useless leaflets to people- that ship has sailed.

• What enforcement measures should be considered in parallel with the introduction of a DRS?

Don't use words such as enforce. It creates a us vs them mentality we have in Ireland. There needs to be pride in this - put that back to the people. It is up to gov't and citizens to change their outlook. Embrace don't chastise.

• How should cross-border issues be treated to ensure producers are not at a competitive disadvantage relative to producers in Northern Ireland?



Well in fairness, it's better for them and the environment. The public will buy into companies that offer a 'greener' future. Leave the door open for a north and south partnership in the future re DRS recycling.
