Fourth Report from the Oversight Group for the Implementation of Recommendations in the HIQA Investigation Report on Portlaoise Hospital

- 1. The HIQA Investigation Report on Portlaoise Hospital called for the establishment of an oversight group to oversee the implementation of the recommendations contained in the Report. The Minister approved the establishment of an Oversight Group.
- 2. This is the fourth report from the Oversight Group to the Minister on the progress being achieved in the implementation of the HIQA recommendations. The report covers progress made for the period to 30th November, 2015 which was discussed at the Oversight Group meeting on 16th December. To date the Oversight Group has met on seven occasions and the Group's overall assessment continues to be that the HSE is making a significant effort at local and national management levels to work towards implementation of the HIQA Portlaoise recommendations.
- 3. The next meeting of the Oversight Group is scheduled for 26th January 2016 to review the progress of implementation up to the 31st December 2015. In light of the issues raised by families at the meeting with the Minister in Portlaoise on 12th January and my meeting with Dr Susan O'Reilly on 15th January, the Oversight Group intends to press the HSE further to ensure arrangements and resources are in place to meet needs identified by families.
- 4. The Oversight Group continues to monitor the agreed Implementation Plan on a monthly basis which shows the progress of implementation of each of the eight HIQA recommendations contained in the HIQA Portlaoise Report. The attached Implementation Plan for the period to 30th November, 2015 shows the actions, milestones, timelines and status of implementation of the plan.
- 5. The Implementation Plan shows a large number of actions completed and a large proportion on track for implementation by the timeline set. There are minor challenges in relation to some actions. These challenges are largely due to timing issues where the action is being progressed but it has missed the project completion date. These are regarded as minor challenges where the action will be completed but slightly delayed. A list of the "minor challenges" is attached at *Appendix A* with an explanation for each.
- 6. A copy of the Implementation Plan to 30th November, 2015 will be placed on the Department's website in the coming days.
