**Performance Delivery Agreement 2021** 

## 1. Background and context

### 1.1 Objectives of this Agreement

The purpose of this Agreement is to define, in the context of the resource inputs provided, the targets by which the performance of the Office of the State Pathologist (OSP) will be measured in 2021. The ongoing supports that the Department of Justice will provide to the OSP in this regard, and the mechanisms for monitoring and appraising performance, form part of the overall governance arrangements between the two parties and as such are set out in the separate but complementary Oversight Agreement 2020-22.

## 1.2 Inputs

#### 1.2.1 Financial Inputs

The OSP's budget allocation for 2021 is as follows:

<sup>\*</sup> Timeframes for finalising PME reports are not fully within OSP's control owing to dependencies on the receipt of ancillary investigation reports (toxicology etc) from external providers. The Covid-19 crisis has exacerbated pre-existing delays in receiving such external reports and has contributed significantly to the decision to lower the relevant target percentage for 2021. The current procedures and processes for production of PME reports will be reviewed by OSP in 2021 to identify possible efficiencies that would support faster turnaround times.
