BYE-LAW No. 486

No. 8 *or* LIMERICK DISTRICT.

I, GEARÓID MAC PHARTHALÁIN, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Agriculture, in exercise of the powers conferred by the Fisheries Acts, 1842 to 1953, the Fisheries (Delegation of Ministerial Functions) Orders, 1951 to 1953, and of every and any other power me in this behalf enabling, hereby make the following Bye-law:—

1. This Bye-law may be cited as the River Deel Bye-law No. 486, 1954.
2. The Interpretation Act, 1937 (No. 38 of 1937), applies to this Bye-law.
3. IT IS PROHIBITED to fish or to attempt to fish by any means whatsoever in the following parts of the River Deel, in the townlands of Aghalacka, Cloonreask and Askeaton, and County of Limerick:—
  - (a) Between the weir or dam known as the Round Weir and a line drawn across the river parallel to the said weir, at a distance of thirty yards downstream.
  - (b) Between the weir or waterfall next below the Round Weir and a line drawn across the river from the head sluices of the adjoining mill-race, along the foundations of the old foot-bridge.
  - (c) Between the weir or dam next above the bridge across the river in the town of Askeaton and known as George's Weir and a line drawn across the river parallel to the said weir at a distance of thirty yards downstream.
  - (d) In that portion of the River Deel within one hundred yards downstream of any point on the downstream face of the bridge across the river in the town of Askeaton.
4. IT IS PROHIBITED to have in possession any mounted fishing rod with line attached thereto on the bridge across the River Deel in the town of Askeaton or in any place on or near the banks of the said river within one hundred yards downstream of the downstream face of that bridge.
5. The River Deel Bye-law, No. 383, 1927, is hereby revoked.
6. Each and every person offending against this Bye-law shall forfeit and pay for each such offence a sum not exceeding Five Pounds, and any rod or other instrument used or found contrary to this Bye-law shall as a statutory consequence of conviction stand forfeited.
