Trawling from Steam Vessels in part of WATERFORD HARBOUR.

BY-LAW.

*Returns for
Amendment*

We, the Inspectors of Irish Fisheries, in pursuance of the powers and authorities in us vested by the "Steam Trawling Ireland Act," (1889,) do make and ordain the following By-Law, by which it is prohibited, and it is hereby prohibited to use from any Steamer or Steamship, or Vessel propelled by steam, the method of fishing known as Trawling, in that part of Waterford Harbour lying to the Northward of an imaginary line drawn from Gaultier Cottage in the County of Waterford, to Broomhill Point in the County of Wexford. *Provided always that this prohibition shall not affect, or be taken to prohibit, the use of the method of fishing known as Trawling from Steam Yachts not fishing for sale—*
