## BY-LAW.

## No. 8, or Limerick District.

By the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland.

The Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland, by virtue and in exercise of the powers in them vested under the Agriculture and Technical Instruction (Ireland) Act, 1899, and of every other power enabling them in this behalf, do make and ordain the following By-Law:—

It is hereby prohibited to use any net for the purpose of taking fish or with the intent to take fish in any part of the River Feale and its tributaries above the Mill Dam across said River in the Townlands of Curraghatoosane and Islandmacloughry, near the Town of Listowel, save landing nets for use solely as auxiliary to fishing legally with rod and line, and save nets used legally for the capture of eels.

Each and every person offending against the above By-Law shall, for each offence, forfeit and pay a sum of FIVE POUNDS; and every net used contrary thereto shall be forfeited.

In witness whereof the Department of Agriculture and Technical Instruction for Ireland have hereunto set their official seal this Fifteenth day of April, One Thousand Nine Hundred and Ten.
