Application for an Aquaculture Licence and a Foreshore Licence and Invitation for Public Submissions or Observations on Appropriate Assessment

The applicant listed in the table below applied to the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine for an Aquaculture Licence under Section 10 of the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1997 to cultivate Red, Green and Brown seaweed at Blacksod Bay, Belmullet, Co. Mayo.

The same applicant has applied for a Foreshore Licence under Section 3 of the Foreshore Act 1933, as amended, for the areas of foreshore to be used for these aquaculture activities.

Notice is hereby given pursuant to Regulation 8 of SI 236/1998 – Aquaculture (Licence Application) Regulations, as amended, that the applicant listed in the above table has applied for an Aquaculture Licence under the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1997.

The same applicant has applied for a Foreshore Licence under the Foreshore Act 1933, as amended.

In this regard, public submissions are invited on the proposed application.

Invitation for Public Submissions or Observations on Appropriate Assessment

Notice is hereby given in accordance with Regulation 42 of SI 477/2011 – European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011, as amended, that the Minister for Agriculture, Food and the Marine in considering an application for an Aquaculture Licence under the Fisheries (Amendment) Act 1997 and an application for a Foreshore Licence under the Foreshore Act 1933, as amended, and in particular whether or not the project, has determined that an Appropriate Assessment is required as the plan or project is not directly connected with or necessary to the management of the site as a European Site and it cannot be excluded, on the basis of objective scientific information following screening under the Regulation, that the plan or project, individually or in combination with other plans or projects, will have a significant effect on a European site.

In considering these matters, the Minister had regard to the following:

1. The application for an Aquaculture Licence and a Foreshore Licence.
2. The Screening for Appropriate Assessment Report.

The Minister will make a determination as to whether or not the proposed project will adversely affect the integrity of a European site in accordance with Regulation 42(11) of the European Communities (Birds and Natural Habitats) Regulations 2011, as amended, and, in doing so, shall have regard to the matters in Regulation 42(12).

Timeframes for Submissions and Access to Information

Members of the public who wish to make a submission or observation in writing concerning the proposed Aquaculture and Foreshore application or concerning the Appropriate Assessment, may do so within 30 days between 30 April 2024 and 29 May 2024.
