

Funding from Government for Rural and Community Development

Rural Regeneration and Development Fund

As part of Project Ireland 2040, the Government has committed to providing an additional €1 billion for a new Rural Regeneration and Development Fund over the period 2019 to 2027. This Fund will provide investment to support rural renewal for suitable projects in towns and villages with a population of less than 10,000, and outlying areas. This funding is available to state bodies. The new Fund provides an unprecedented opportunity to support the revitalisation of rural Ireland, to make a significant and sustainable impact on rural communities, and to address de-population in small towns, villages and rural areas. LEADER

€250 million in grant aid will be provided to rural communities and businesses under the 2014 -2020 Programme. Grant aid is provided to projects under the themes: Economic Development, Enterprise Development and Job Creation, Social Inclusion, and Rural Environment. The LEADER Programme is administered by Local Action Groups (LAGs). To apply for funding submit an Expression of Interest to the LAG in your area. Community Enhancement Programme

This programme aims to enhance communities, address disadvantage and improve social cohesion at local level. It provides capital to small scale infrastructure projects of a regenerative nature in disadvantaged areas. Local Community Development Committees administer this programme on behalf of the Department of Rural and Community Development. For further information **contact: cep@dracd.gov.ie**

Town and Village Renewal Scheme

The aim of this scheme is to support the revitalisation of towns and villages by improving the living and working environment of communities and increasing the potential to support economic activity into the future. This scheme provides funding to increase the attractiveness of the town, or village, as a local commercial and social centre, as a place in which to live and work, enhance the environment and amenities, and promote the town or village's potential for tourism. The Department of Rural and Community Development takes recommendations from Local Authorities on funding for projects under this scheme. TidyTowns

Volunteer committees have been making Ireland a more attractive place to live, work and to do business in. TidyTowns allows communities to feed into how their area develops. Approximately 900 communities enter the competition every year. The Department of Rural and Community Development has operated a grant scheme for entrants to TidyTowns. In addition to the formal recognition of performing well in the competition, monetary prizes are awarded to the winners. For more information **contact: tidytowns@dracd.gov.ie**

Seniors Alert Scheme

This scheme provides personal monitored alarms to enable older persons to continue to live securely in their homes. This scheme is administered by Pobal on behalf of the Department of Rural and Community Development. To be eligible for funding, community and voluntary groups should register with Pobal. The CLÁR Programme

This is a targeted investment programme which provides funding for small scale infrastructural projects in rural areas that have suffered the greatest levels of population decline. The aim of CLÁR is to support the sustainable development of identified CLÁR areas by encouraging people to live and work there. Groups applying for funding for schools, community safety measures, play areas or sensory gardens should contact their Local Authority. Groups applying for First Response Support or Mobility or Cancer Care Transport should contact the Department of Rural and Community Development directly. Local Improvement Scheme

This scheme carries out improvement works on private or non-public roads. Often these roads lead to multiple residences, parcels of land that support agricultural activity or amenities such as lakes, rivers or beaches. Local Authorities apply directly to the Department of Rural and Community Development for funding under this scheme. Outdoor Recreation Infrastructure Scheme

This scheme provides funding for the development of new outdoor recreational infrastructure. It also provides for the necessary maintenance, enhancement or promotion of existing outdoor recreational infrastructure in rural areas across Ireland. This investment helps to attract additional visitor numbers and opens new employment opportunities for local people. Social Inclusion and Community Activation Programme (SICAP)

SICAP aims to reduce disadvantage and poverty in Ireland by promoting social inclusion and to strengthen communities. SICAP works to support individuals from designated target groups and local community groups. SICAP is cofunded by the Department of Rural and Community Development and the European Social Fund Programme for Employability, Inclusion and Learning 2014-2020. It is delivered by Programme Implementers in the Local Community Development Committees. To access funding under SICAP contact the Programme Implementer directly. Community Services Programme

This programme supports social enterprises to provide local services and create employment opportunities for disadvantaged people. A contribution is provided towards the costs of employing staff. There are three main types of projects funded under the programme:

1. Community halls and facilities available for community use which enable the day-to-day operation of community infrastructure.
2. Community services for disadvantaged people.
3. Community enterprises which tend to have an emphasis on employing people far from the labour market.

PEACE IV

This is a cross-border Programme co-financed through the European Regional Development Fund supporting peace and reconciliation through actions that promote social and economic stability in Northern Ireland and the Border Region of Ireland (Cavan, Donegal, Leitrim, Louth, Monaghan and Sligo).
