The Digital Issues Unit is part of Economic Division in Department of the Taoiseach. Its current role includes:

- managing the Data Forum which brings together experts from different areas (industry, civil society, legal experts and the public sector) to contribute to dialogue on the societal issues arising from the continuing growth in generation and use of personal data; ensures discussion between public and private sector on issues like implementation of GDPR and other new EU initiatives
- preparing a new National Digital Strategy (working with other key Depts) which aims to articulate a vision for how Ireland can grasp the opportunities offered by digitalisation and respond to its challenges, for the benefit of our economy and society; public consultation and engagement with stakeholders on development of the Strategy took place in 2019
- organising the annual Digital Summit, under the aegis of the Data Forum, to promote Ireland's profile as a location for thought leadership in the digital and data issues
- supporting the Interdepartmental Group on Data Protection Issues which includes representatives of all Departments; work includes shared training provision for GDPR implementation and Brexit preparations
- supporting the work of the Minister of State with responsibility for Data Protection, including international and domestic engagements with business and potential investors
- participating in the work of the Interdepartmental Group on the EU Digital Single Market (led by D\BEI)
- co-ordinating the Government's role in support of the proposed Grand Canal Innovation District in the Grand Canal Docks

Q: Request that NESC might identify existing international research, guidelines and case studies of good practice on citizen participation in the planning process.

Public participation is a key feature of the Irish planning system (Relate, 2018). This short note provides some examples of guidelines, case studies and research on citizen participation. This is not an exhaustive list but indicative of the material available.

- While not detailing the participative process, this overview of the Irish planning systems in Ireland and Northern Ireland is useful (Cave and Semple, 2018).¹ See also Relate (2018).²
- The new Office of the Planning Regulator has a role in improving public awareness of the planning process and supporting research and innovation. There is a current commitment to implement interactive, ICT-driven solutions to enable better participation by the public in the plan-making process.
